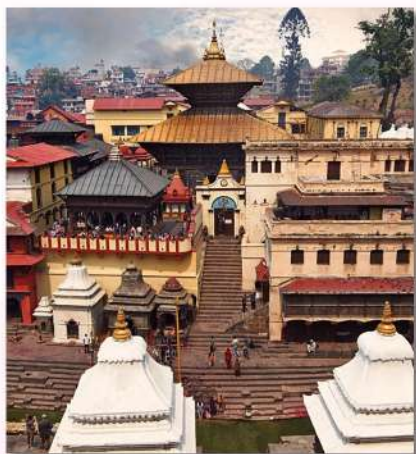

DAY 1 ARRIVAL KATHMANDU (X/X/D)

DAY 2 KATHMANDU SIGHTSEEING (B/X/D)

Pashupatinath Temple: One of the most sacred Hindu shrines in the world, Pashupatinath lies 5 Km east of the city center. The richly-ornamented pagoda houses the sacred linga, or phallic symbol, of Lord Shiva. Chronicle indicates the temple's existence prior to 400 AD. Devotees

can be seen taking ritual dips in the holy Bagmati River flowing beside the temple, also a World heritage site.



Boudhnath Stupa: Lies about 6 km to the east of downtown Kathmandu and is the largest stupa in the valley. It looms 36 meters high and present one of the most fascinating specimens of stupa design. Boudhnath a world heritage is also known as Khasti. There are more than 45 Buddhist monasteries in the area.



Budhanilkantha: Nestled in the himalayan foothills well north of Kathmandu's city center is a wholly remarkable Hindu temple. The site pays homage to Vishnu (Narayan) whose likeness floats on the sea of bliss reclining upon the multi-headed snake Shesh. It's believed the 16-foot (5-meter) long sculpture made from a single block of basalt, was created during the

6th-century CE by Vishnugupta, an early king of the Kathmandu Valley.



Kathmandu City Durbar Square: Complex of palaces, courtyards and temples, built between the 12th and 18th centuries, used to be the seat of the ancient Malla kings of Kathmandu. An intriguing piece here is the 17th century stone inscription set into the wall of the palace with writings in 15 languages. The Durbar Square, protected as a UNESCO world heritage site, is

the social, religious and urban focal point of the city. There are also museums inside the palace building. There is also a temple of the only LIVING GODDESS – KUMARI.

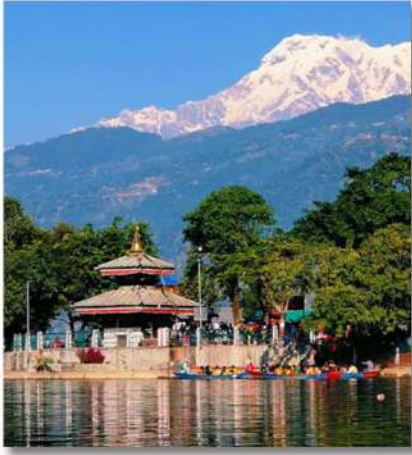


DAY 3 KATHMANDU - POKHARA (B/X/D)

After breakfast drive to Pokhara which will take about 6 hours drive and is about 200 Km. Pokhara is a place of remarkable natural beauty. The serenity of Phewa Lake and the magnificence of the fish tail summit rising behind it create an ambiance of peace and magic.

At an elevation lower than Kathmandu, it has much more tropical feel to it, a fact well appreciated by the beautiful diversity of flowers which prosper in its environ. Indeed, the valley surrounding Pokhara is home to thick forest, gushing rivers, emerald lakes and of course,

the world famous. Views of the Himalayas.



Taal Barahi Temple: A serene pagoda-style temple located on a small island in the middle of Phewa Lake, dedicated to Goddess Barahi. Visitors reach the temple by a short boat ride, enjoying peaceful lake views and the surrounding mountain scenery. It's a popular spot for worship, photos, and calm moments by the water.



DAY 4 POKHARA SIGHTSEEING (B/X/D)

Shiva Statue: Pumdikot view tower in Pokhara is one of the most incredible vantage points situated in Nepal. Known for its 3 tiered Shiva Statue and the picturesque views of Annapurna Himalayan Range, Machhapuchhre, Dhaulagiri, Manaslu and many other neighbouring moun-

tains. The Pumdikot is an emerging destination around Pokhara that features a shiva statue, natural settlement, lake view, valley view, mountains and peaceful scenery. The Shiva idol in the Phumdibhumdi village is about 108 ft tall, but the actual Shiva's sitting statue is 51 ft tall.



Bindabasini Temple: Situated in the northern part of the beautiful lake city of Nepal is the temple of Bindabasini. Located near the busy Old Bazaar of Pokhara, the temple of Bindabasini stands proudly at about 3000 feet above the sea level along the Annapurna and Machhapuhhare Himalayan Range. Bindabasini temple,

the temple of the guardian deity is of great religious value to the Hindus living in Pokhara. The temple is dedicated to the Hindu goddess Durga and is regarded as the guardian deity of Pokhara.



Devi's Fall: On 31st July 1961 A.D. in the afternoon a sudden flood from Fewa Lake swept away a Swiss citizen Mrs. Devis who was having a bath with her husband beside it. She was drowned and dead. She was recovered after a long attempt since then. It has been taken its name "Devi's fall". Length: 500 meters underground water flow. Depth: 100 Feet. Most

people pronounce Devi's fall as Davi's Fall. Locally known as Patale Chhango.



Gupteswor: Gupteswor is a famous cave in Pokhara. Inside the cave we can find the temple of the Lord Shiva. Lord Shiva is great god of Hindu. People worship to Lord Shiva and pray for their happiness and wealth. You can also see the beautiful temple in this cave. Gupteshwor Mahadev Cave a huge stalagmite worshiped as a Shiva lingams. The ticket only covers the

temple, there you can pay another a low tunnel behind the cave, the behind a spring waters of Devi's Falls. At the ceiling of the cave, you can see cracks and beautiful mark by the force of the waters. There are two caves inside it. You have to pay entry fee to see the natural cave of Gupteswor, electricity is managed for convenience of visitors. Second part of the cave closes during the Jun, July, Aug and September due to heavy rain and flood from Devi's fall. It is an interesting experience to visit Gupteswor.

DAY 5 KATHMANDU - NAGARKOT (B/X/D)

After breakfast, drive back to Kathmandu. Upon reaching Kathmandu, continue drive to Nagarkot.

Nagarkot: Of the possible destination, Nagarkot (altitude 2175m) is by far the most popular. Located 30Km east of Kathmandu,



Nagarkot has developed into favorite weekend getaway among those seeking mountain views in comfort and quiet. At sunrise, the Himalayan range, stretching from Daulagiri in the west all the way past Everest to Kanchenjunga in the east, emerges from the darkness to greet the happy visitor with its awe inspiring majesty and beauty.



DAY 6 **KATHMANDU - BHAKTAPUR - KATHMANDU (B/X/D)**

Morning view sunrise and after breakfast drive back to Kathmandu.

Sanga - Tallest Shiva Statue: The statue of Shiva located at Sanga is 108 ft. tall making it the tallest statue of Shiva in the world and lies on

the way to Dhulikhel from Kathmandu. Shiva's vehicle lies in the front of Statue and statues of Parvati, Ganesh and Kumar is at the left corner. It extends in 75 ropanies of land and is engrossed with well maintained garden and a series of 12 shiva lingams.



Kedarnath The Doleshwor Mahadev temple that is considered religiously important is located at Sipadol-6, 4 km south of Jagati, Bhaktapur. This temple is worshipped as the head of the Lord Kedarnath. According to the long held belief, the head of the deity originated in this place while the remaining body part in Kedarnath of India. A large rock outcropping amidst green

forest is worshipped as a representation of Lord Kedarnath.

Swoyambhunath Stupa: Watches over the valley from the top of a hillock on its western side, the stupa is one of the holiest Buddhist sites in Nepal and its establishment is linked to the creation of the



Kathmandu Valley out of a primordial lake. Swoyambhu is also known as Sengu and is listed as a World heritage site.
